## TOTAL HEALTH CARE DEBUTS MOBILE HEALTH OUTREACH UNIT

Total Health Care, one of Maryland’s largest minority-run, nonprofit, tax-exempt community health centers, unveiled its new Mobile Health Outreach Unit April 9 at a special community COVID-19 vaccination and testing event outside St. James Episcopal Church in west Baltimore. Nearly 100 people attended the event and 65

received a COVID-19 vaccination. The COVID-19 pandemic has drawn new attention to the inequities in access to health care that exist in Baltimore, especially in the City’s most disadvantaged communities. With its new mobile unit, Total Health Care will expand its ongoing efforts to provide vital health care screenings, services and education

to those in Baltimore who are most in need. In addition to COVID-19 vaccinations and tests, Total Health Care plans to partner with other community-centered organizations to offer other screenings and immunizations, including HIV/AIDS testing, through its mobile unit. Funding for the Mobile Health Outreach Unit was provided by The

Gamma Boulé Foundation (GBF) of Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity, which raised \$240,000 to support the purchase of the vehicle and its ongoing operations. Additional funding for the unit was provided by The Mamie and Jerome Todd Relief Fund, established by Ben Jealous to support those in Baltimore most impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
